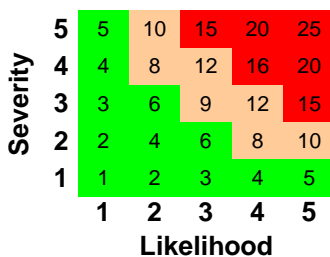

<b>Severity</b>	1	<b>Negligible</b> Dealt with by in-house first aid, etc	<b>Likelihood</b>	1	<b>Rare</b> - May occur but only in rare circumstances
	2	<b>Minor</b> Medical help needed. Treatment by medical professional/hospital outpatient, etc		2	<b>Unlikely</b> to occur but could happen (<25%)
	3	<b>Moderate</b> Significant non-permanent injury. Overnight hospitalisation (inpatient)		3	<b>Possible</b> and likely to occur at some time (25% - 50%)

2	Getting hit by an arrow.	Archers Visitors. Public	3	2	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Shooting will always be under control of an experienced archer, acting as team captain.</li> <li>• Team captains will tell archers when its ok to shoot and to collect arrows.</li> <li>• All visitors will be MUST behind the shooting line.</li> <li>• Only point arrows at targets.</li> </ul>	3	1	3
3	Walking into arrows	Archers	2	3	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Walk slowly to target area, Always looking forward and at ground to see obstructions.</li> <li>• Walk slowly down the side of the target.</li> </ul>	2	1	2
